

# Publication of *Short Papers*

## IEEE Transactions on Instrumentation and Measurement

IEEE Transactions on Instrumentation and Measurement (TIM) has been publishing *Short Papers* at the end of each monthly issue. This is intended to provide our authors with a means for a relatively rapid publication of novel, significant and time-sensitive articles in the focus areas of TIM.

Submission of *Short Papers* via Allentrack, the web-based manuscript submission and review process system for TIM, MUST adhere to a set of specific guidelines in order to expedite the review and editorial processes. Submission guidelines are posted at (<http://tim.allentrack.net>, under *Short Paper* Submission).

*Short papers* are limited to a minimum of two and a maximum of three published pages and *must* be submitted in the two-column format of the IEEE transactions. There will be no author bios published at the end of *Short Papers*. Subsequent to the review process, a decision of “Accept, with follow up modifications prior to publication” or “Reject” will be rendered. Rejected papers may be revised and resubmitted as a new manuscript. To partially defer the publications cost, authors agree to pay a mandatory page charge for the second and third pages. The amount of the required page charge can be found at <http://tim.allentrack.net>, under *Short Paper* Submission.

An accepted *Short Paper* will be rapid-posted on the IEEE *Xplore* soon after the authors have approved the IEEE proofs of their paper, and will be published within 3-4 months after that.

A *Short Paper* is considered an archival journal publication and therefore must:

- possess technical novelty,
- direct relevance to the focus areas of TIM (see <http://www.ieee-ims.org/site/index.php>, under publications page),
- be on a current topic with a certain degree of publication-time sensitivity,
- have an adequate number of relevant references representative of a thorough literature search putting the submitted work in proper context of previously published work,
- include a no shorter than a 250-word abstract, and
- ***NO*** part of it may have been previously published in ***ANY*** form including as part of a past, present or future conference proceedings paper.
