This year, DLP Evaluations will be conducted in-person and virtually on Zoom on Tuesday, May 21^{st} , at I^2MTC 2024 in Glasgow, Scotland. In-person presentations are preferred, and virtual presentations will be conducted live with the Evaluation Committee in the time zone of the conference (BST or UTC +1).

Applications are accepted through May 5, 2024 (11:59pm CDT/UTC-5). Presentations submitted for an evaluation slot *must be no longer* than 12 minutes. Q&A sessions will not be permitted as part of the presentation, and the evaluation schedule with assigned timeslots for May 21st will be provided to each applicant via email by May 17th, 2024.

- Measurement Precision, Sensitivity, and Noise
- Measurement Fundamentals (accuracy, trueness, repeatability, resolution, etc.)
- Calibration and Calibration Periodicity

- Robotics/Automated Measurements
- Nanotechnology in Instrumentation and Measurement
- Big Data and Metrology
- Measurement for Food Safety
- State-of-the-Art of Traditional Measurements and Instrumentation (Digitizers, Voltmeters, Spectrum Analyzers, etc.).

- Abstract of the presentation topic (between 500 and 1000 words)
- A biography of the presenter (limited to 150 words)
